Finding Hope in Delaware

"I don't know how to be a parent." "I can't afford diapers." "What if I make a mistake?" These are just a few of the questions and concerns that women and men have when experiencing an unplanned pregnancy, concerns that are real and genuine. That is why, over 10 years ago, A Door of Hope Pregnancy Center developed the Hope Rewards Program. This program is how the center builds up mothers and fathers to be the best parents they can be while earning much needed material items such as car seats, strollers, clothing, and diapers.

Lisa* came to A Door of Hope several years ago in search of material support during her first pregnancy. She has continued in the program ever since. Alongside her client advocate Jodi, Lisa has completed dozens of parenting lessons while also meeting with Jodi to discuss her struggles and victories. "The lessons help me to be a better parent and taught me about what I can do to be successful," explains Lisa. "Jodi has been my friend over the years and has helped me to grow in courage, wisdom, and knowledge."

When reflecting on her years working with Lisa and her two beautiful children, Jodi notes how hard Lisa works and how she perseveres under trial. "She just keeps going for her kids," explains Jodi. "She never gives up!" Over the years, Lisa expressed a desire to learn more about faith. Last year, after completing several lessons, Lisa boldly placed her trust and faith in Jesus Christ. "Jodi's friendship in this program really helped me to realize that it was important to grow in God too!"

- This report is a collaborative project between Charlotte Lozier Institute (CLI) and Care Net. We are grateful to Heartbeat International and the National Institute of Family and Life Advocates for their contributions towards data collection from their affiliated U.S. pregnancy centers.
- Value of services is based upon materials and services provided by 4 pregnancy centers in the state of Delaware in calendar year 2022. None of the centers reporting data received state or federal funding in 2022.
- Total savings are calculated based on cost estimates of services, classes and baby items provided to clients. The sources for the cost estimates and valuation of items and services can be found in the Methodology section, pgs. 15-16, of the 2022 CLI national pregnancy center report, "Hope for A New Generation" (<https://lozierinstitute.org/pcr/>), except for the following state-specific labor costs.
- The Delaware mean hourly wages referenced are as follows: Social Workers in local/state government is \$38.43 per hour - BLS OES code 21-1029, Registered Nurses is \$45.51 per hour - OES code 29-1141, and Diagnostic Medical Sonographers is \$42.49 per hour - OES code 29-2032.
- The estimated savings does not include housing and other monetary assistance provided to some clients. We advocate for our clients by networking with hundreds of county, state and non-profit social service organizations around the country. We cannot quantify the value of emotional support given to the women we help through phone calls and caring volunteers.
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
