Finding Hope in New Jersey

Brittany's story begins with excitement about expanding her family. Being married for two years, both she and her husband looked forward to what this pregnancy meant for their growing family. But their happiness quickly turned to distress when they received unexpected news at a 12-week ultrasound appointment held in their doctor's office. Brittany is a nurse and understands medicine, so the news from the physician at this facility was overwhelming. When that ultrasound was completed, he told her he was concerned about the imaging, specifically it showed that the baby had a cystic hygroma. He presented only negative outcomes resulting from this, concluding that the best option would be to terminate the pregnancy. Brittany and her husband were devastated by this news.

Having been to Solutions Health and Pregnancy Center for a pregnancy test and pregnancy confirmation ultrasound prior to her 12-week ultrasound appointment with the doctor, Brittany knew that she would feel immediately supported there.

She realized that more than medical advice, she needed someone to guide her to God and remind her that: "God is bigger than any diagnosis." Solutions provided the encouragement and support she needed during this time.

A staff member there became her "prayer warrior," and for the next one to two weeks, they dedicated themselves to prayer. The staff at Solutions completely changed Brittany's mindset. One staff member reminded her that "God hand chose this baby" for her to be his or her mother. This counsel gave Brittany the resolve to go forward with the pregnancy, believing her child would be a miracle.

Two weeks later, at a follow-up appointment the physician stated that the ultrasound was "perfectly normal." Brittany was overcome with joy, thanking God for performing a miracle. She is profoundly grateful to Solutions for helping her to choose to continue the pregnancy. Brittany gave thanks to Solutions because, "now ... there will be another baby on this planet because of [their] generosity and kindness."

Today, Brittany and her husband's relationships with the Lord have grown, and they desire to share the truth of who He is with everyone around them.

- Value of services is based upon materials and services provided by 39 pregnancy centers in the state of New Jersey in calendar year 2024. None of the centers reporting data received state or federal funding in 2024.

- The New Jersey mean hourly wages referenced are as follows: Social Workers in local/state government is \$35.09 per hour - BLS OES code 21-1029, Registered Nurses is \$51.44 per hour - OES code 29-1141, and Diagnostic Medical Sonographers is \$48.62 per hour - OES code 29-2032.
- The estimated savings does not include housing and other monetary assistance provided to some clients. We advocate for our clients by networking with hundreds of county, state and non-profit social service organizations around the country. We cannot quantify the value of emotional support given to the women we help through phone calls and caring volunteers.
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
